Dear Governor Abbott,

Thank you for your leadership and response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As you know, some states, counties, and localities across the country have imposed "shelter in place" orders restricting the work and activities of employees in "non-essential businesses." While we believe these orders are well-intentioned and can be necessary, we believe that manufacturers have much to contribute to the public welfare in this difficult time. As such, we are requesting that any potential "shelter in place" order include an exemption for industries included in the March 19, 2020 <a href="Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency guidance">Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency guidance</a> on essential critical infrastructure workers.

Manufacturers provide many critical functions, particularly in times of national crisis. As Jay Timmons, President and CEO of the National Association of Manufacturers, has said, "The country is depending on the many things our members make—from equipment and vehicles needed for our nation's first responders, to items seemingly not critical but very much a part of the supply chain necessary for both comfort and survival during these uncertain times."

What businesses need is clear guidance that is consistent across all jurisdictions. The federal Department of Homeland Security, as part of the CISA guidelines linked above, has provided ways to clearly identify critical infrastructure sectors during COVID-19. We encourage you to carefully consider these guidelines in ANY order you may make to enhance public safety at this time. Certainly, the guidelines provide by CISA don't cover all critical needs from every industry. Therefore, we would suggest implementing a prompt waiver process for industries and products that are vital to all citizens, but may not seem to be immediately covered by the guidance. Such a process should allow a business to provide evidence that they are adhering to any guidance for businesses and employers provided by the Centers for Disease Control while still providing their needed service or product. Once that evidence is provided, we hope that you would consider quickly granting that waiver from any "shelter in place" order.

We represent all types and sizes of businesses, which make and provide all kinds of essential products to Texans and the world. We are happy to connect you with any of

our members who can give you examples of how we can all work together to be safe and provide what our friends and neighbors need most.

Again, thank you for your continued service to Texas. We look forward to working with you on this and other issues.
