
Two Operators in Central Texas







- » Central Texas has ten toll roads operated by two separate transportation agencies.
- » Each agency supports its own customer service center and billing/collection processes.





Tag, You're It

- » The Mobility Authority does not operate its own electronic tag.
- » We are TAGNOSTIC, which means that all interoperable electronic tags are accepted on Mobility Authority roadways.








» Our Pay By Mail program offers alternate payment options and methods to customers who choose not to have a tag, or whose tag accounts are not in good standing.

Recently Opened Roads




» Project Description: Three tolled and three nontolled lanes in each direction.

» Project Limits: US 290 to SH 71

» Project Length: 8 miles

» Total Project Cost: \$743 Million

» Project Status: Newly Opened to Traffic





Recently Opened Roads








- » 16 miles of bicycle lanes
- » 10 miles of shared use paths
- » 7 miles of sidewalks
- » 4 pedestrian bridges
- » 2 major trailheads
- » Connections to the regional trail system
- » Aesthetics at key locations aligned with community values and aesthetic preferences



Recently Opened Roads



- » Project Description: Three new flyovers between 290 Toll and SH 130. Two tolled, one non-tolled.
- » Project Limits: US 290/SH 130 Intersection
- » Total Project Cost: \$127 Million
- » Project Status: Newly Opened to Traffic
 - South-to-west flyover opened January 2020,8 months ahead of schedule
 - North-to-west flyover opened July 2020,5 months ahead of schedule
 - » East-to-south flyover opened February 2021, 4 months ahead of schedule







183A Phase III Project



» Project Description: Extension of the 183A Toll Road with two tolled lanes in each direction.


» Project Limits: SH 29 to Hero Way

» Project Length: 6.6 miles

» Total Project Cost: \$277.3 Million



183A Phase III Typical Section






183 North Mobility Project





- » Project Description: Adding two variably priced express lanes in each direction and widening to four non-tolled general-purpose lanes
- » Project Limits: SH 45 to MoPac/Loop 1
- » Project Description: Express Lanes along 9 miles of US 183
- » Total Project Cost: \$612 Million
- » Project Status:
 - » Construction projected to begin early 2022





183 North Typical Section










Barton Skyway Ramp Relief

- » Project Scope: Adding auxiliary and merge lanes between Barton Skyway and Loop 360 to relieve congestion on southbound MoPac at the Winsted/Enfield on-ramp merge
- » Proposed Project Cost: \$15 Million
- » Project Status:
 - » Construction anticipated to begin mid-2022
 - » Construction anticipated to be complete in mid-2023






MoPac South Environmental Study



- » Project Description: Proposal to add one or two express lanes in each direction
- » Project Limits: Cesar Chavez to Slaughter Lane
- » Project Length: Approximately 8 miles
- » Proposed Project Cost: \$825M
- » Project Status:
 - » Following an extended pause; working to advance schematic design and environmental process
